

What to bring to camp

Put your child's name on everything that is brought to camp. Show them what has been packed; or better yet, have them do the packing. Lost and found items are kept for one month after camp and then disposed of.

- Sleeping bag or sheets/blankets
- Pillow and pillowcase
- Shirts/blouses
- Shorts, long pants and underwear
- Socks and two pairs of sturdy outdoor shoes
- Pajamas
- Jacket, cap/hat and rainwear
- Modest swimwear
- Royal feast clothing--For this banquet, campers are asked to dress as nobility (princes, princesses, knights, etc.). Be creative and have fun!
- Complete Bible (preferably NIV)
- Envelopes, stamps and pencils
- Flashlight and camera (optional)
- Soap and towels
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Brush or comb
- Tissues or handkerchiefs
- Medication (must be screened by camp medical staff at check-in)
- Insect repellent (pump preferred)
- Friendly attitude

Additional gear for rock climbing

- One pair of loose fitting sweats or pants
- Athletic shoes with a snug fit
- Backpack or bookbag (if you have one)
- Sunglasses

What not to bring

Unacceptable items may be collected and returned before check-out.

- × Clothing with inappropriate messages
- × Radio, CDs, electronic games or cell phones
- × Knives, fireworks, tobacco products, alcohol or non-prescription drugs
- × Gum, candy or excessive snacks
- × Money
- × Inappropriate language or negative attitude
